

REGULATIONS & CONDITIONS OF PLAY – LADIES' SECTION

HANDICAP REQUIREMENTS

Ladies **MUST HAVE** a valid CONGU handicap before the Entry Closing date.

Members not handicapped at Aberdovey must hand in their Handicap Register before entering if this is their first competition in 2010.

Ladies who have NOT played in 3 Qualifying Competitions may enter Ladies' competitions but will not be eligible to win a prize **AND WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO ENTER THE CADER CUPS.**

COMPETITION BOOK MUST BE SIGNED PRIOR TO PLAY IN A COMPETITION.

CADER CUPS RULES and CONDITION OF PLAY

1 CADER CUP LATE ENTRIES

Players in this category may enter all competitions on elimination from the Cader Cups and paying the appropriate entry fee prior to 6.30 p.m. on the previous day. Times and partners will be allocated by the Committee member responsible for the Cader Cups.

In the event of any Cader Cups round being postponed to the next morning, competitors are reminded that the Rules of Golf do not permit playing in a stroke play competition after match play on the same day.

2 Competitors are requested to report to the starter 10 minutes before their tee time

3 Competitors are requested to walk in on conclusion of match

4 Trolley pullers are only allowed in the Final.

CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES

The official entry form must be used by all competitors and must be in by the closing date stated on the entry form.

The entry fees must accompany the form – cheques to be made payable to "AGC Ladies' Section".

Entry Fees are **Non Refundable** after Closing Date

Entries will be accepted for the Mixed Foursomes Stableford until 6.30 p.m. Tuesday 10th August 2010.

PRACTICE

In accordance with Rule 7-1(b), competitors may not practice on the course before a stroke play event, whether playing morning or afternoon. Practice must be confined to the official practice area and the practice putting green.

PLAYING TIMES

Competitors must play within the scheduled time and may not alter their booked time without permission from the Committee Member organising that competition.

LATENESS TO THE TEE

The player must start at the time established by the Committee.

A competitor who is not on the first tee at her advertised time of start, renders herself liable to disqualification under Rule 6-3. In the absence of circumstances which would warrant the waiving of the penalty of disqualification under Rule 33-7, if the player arrives at her starting point, ready to play, within five minutes after her starting time, the penalty for failure to start on time is two strokes in stroke play and loss of first hole in match play.

BUGGIES

Only those members whose medical condition requires them will be allowed to use these vehicles in competitions. (Medical Certificates must be produced)

It is the competitors' responsibility to make themselves aware of all rules concerning play in each competition
